



What are we up to at the Lois Wagner Memorial Library? We're up to all kinds of things!

In an average month we circulate well over 4,000 items, and issue approximately 30 brand-new library cards. The library has roughly 3,000 monthly visitors, averaging over 137 patrons per day. We usually receive close to 400 hold items for LWML folks and send out 700+ holds to other Suburban Library Cooperative patrons. Plus we generally receive over 300 telephone calls and answer 100+ reference questions. Added to this monthly tally is computer help, tutorials, shelving, cataloging, processing, mending, ordering, children's programming... and much, much more!

We are definitely up to something @ the LWML!




Toddlers, 18-36 months of age, are invited to participate in **Lap Sit** on

Join the **Richmond Readers** as they gather at the library to discuss: "The Light in the Ruins" by Chris Bohjalian


School age kids are invited to a fun **Thanksgiving Craft Program**.
