

## National Library Week April 12-18

Libraries all over the U.S.A. will be celebrating "National Library Week" April 12-18, 2015 with the theme, "Unlimited Possibilities @ Your Library."

First sponsored in 1958, National Library Week is a national observance sponsored by the American Library Association and libraries across the country each April. It is a time to celebrate the contributions of our nation's libraries and librarians, and to promote library use and support.

A theme is selected each year to celebrate National Library Week. The 1958 & 1959 theme was "Wake Up and Read." In 1974, the year our present library was constructed on Division Road, "Grow With Books; Get It All Together" was selected for NLW. When our library's annex was added in 1992, National Library Week's chosen theme was "Your Right To Know: Librarians Make It Happen."

While libraries are frequently the first resource that citizens rely on for information and recreational purposes—sadly, they are often deemed a non-essential community service.
