The Richmond Police Department has recently added two new part-time officers. Officer Stephen Rupkus and Officer Kenneth Richardson were both sworn in during the month of February. We would like to welcome and introduce our newest Officers:

Officer Stephen Rupkus was sworn in on Thursday, February 2<sup>nd</sup>. Officer Rupkus previously worked for the Detroit Police Department and was a Detective with Clinton Township PD before retiring in 2019. He comes to us most recently from the Armada Police Department.



Officer Kenneth Richardson was sworn in on Monday, February 27<sup>th</sup>. Officer Richardson has previously worked as a Police Officer in the Village of Armada. Prior to Armada, he worked as a patrol officer and detective with Clinton Township. He also served in the United States Army at Fort Bragg, North Carolina.

### GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS

GIS are computer-based tools used to store, visualize, analyze, and interpret geographic data. The City of Richmond already uses GIS data in the Planning and Assessing departments to store parcel data such as property owner, tax history, and lot dimensions. The City is in the process of incorporating water and sewer fixed assets into the GIS system. This data will be used to help locate utilities in the field and better analyze condition and replacement needs. Incorporation of these assets into GIS requires the points to be physically located. The points will then be collected by a surveyor.

You may have noticed flags and paint marks as the City is beginning to collect data throughout town. DPW staff are currently focused on locating water service valves (curb stops) and sewer cleanout covers. The cost of this work is covered by an Asset Management Grant received from the State of Michigan. Locating related to the GIS project does not typically require any excavation. **Flags should remain in place for three weeks to allow time for the surveyor to collect the data point.**



## CITY STREET IMPROVEMENTS

**Stone Street** – from Division Road to Madison Street  
Reconstruction of this road will begin at the end of March. Included in the reconstruction is water main replacement, selective driveway and sidewalk improvements, and removal & replacement of the existing asphalt pavement. The project is scheduled for completion by June 30, 2023.



**Diane Lane** – from Forest Avenue to Madeline Street  
Reconstruction of this road will begin in May. Included in the project is selective curb and sidewalk improvements, and removal & replacement of the existing asphalt pavement. The project is scheduled for completion by May 31, 2023.

**Main Street Alley** – from Water Street to Monroe Street  
Reconstruction of the alley way on the East side of Main Street (behind Ken's Country Kitchen, Commercial House, etc) will begin in May. Included in the reconstruction is sanitary sewer replacement and new aggregate base, sidewalk, curb, asphalt pavement, landscaping, decorative lighting, and dumpster enclosures. The project is scheduled for completion by June 30, 2023. Entrance to the municipal lot off Forest Ave will be open for public parking throughout construction.

## RICHMOND HERITAGE FESTIVAL

### BURN PERMIT REGULATIONS

The City of Richmond Fire Department requires that you get a Burn Permit anytime you are going to do open burning. **OPEN BURNING PERMITS ARE FREE.** Permits can be applied for at the Richmond Police Department, 36725 Division Road, or on the City website. Under the "How Do I" tab at the top of the page, under the "Apply For" column, select "Burn Permit" and then click on the underlined "[Burn Permit](#)" link and fill out the online form.

# BURN PERMIT

You must be 18 years or older to obtain a burn permit. During a dry period, the Fire Department may have a ban on open burning & will not issue any permits.

#### City of Richmond

- Campfires must be kept less than 3 feet in diameter & less than 3 feet in height. Fires can be ground pits, mesh grills, and/or fireplaces.
- It must be located more than 50 feet from any structure.
- Permits will be issued for 4 days.
- Residents may have a small camp or cooking fire for recreation.
- The camp fire must be attended at all times.
- The camp fire shall consist only of seasoned dry firewood and shall not emit any obnoxious odors or smoke.
- There is to be no burning of leaves, grass clippings, garbage, sawn, or processed wood.

### YARD WASTE

- Curbside yard waste is collected on Tuesdays from April to November.
- Yard waste must be placed in yard waste bags or garbage cans (32 gallons or less).
- Garbage cans must be marked yard waste.
- Cans can be spray painted with a large "X", or "Yard Waste" stickers are available at City Hall.
- Each bag/can must be 50 lbs or less.
- A maximum of 10 bags or containers can be placed each week.
- Twigs, sticks, and branches 4' or less in length can be bundled with twine. Yard waste mixed with trash will not be accepted.





# RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING SCHEDULE

Use the map and schedule for each year to determine your recycle week as follows:

Streets split by service weeks will be collected on the week indicated (green side one week and gold side the following week). First determine if your residence is located in the green or gold section of the map. The color of the map where your residence is located corresponds to the color on the annual schedule and indicates your recycle week and day for each month and year. Place your recycle cart at the curb on the designated day on the schedule. Waste Management will provide you with a new recycle schedule for dates beyond August 2022.

**PLACE YOUR RECYCLE CART AT THE CURB ON THE SAME DAY AS YOUR TRASH EVERY OTHER WEEK ACCORDING TO THE SCHEDULE.**


