Polls are open at 7:00 am and will remain open until 8:00 pm.



Residents in the City of Richmond will be electing members to the following office: CITY COUNCIL – Three (3) 4-year terms.

Absentee ballots are available for all elections with no reason required; registered voters may contact the local clerk to obtain an application for an absent voter ballot or to sign up to be placed on the permanent absent voter ballot list. All electors who are registered in the City of Richmond are eligible to vote at this election.

Please be aware that early voting will only be offered for statewide and federal elections. The first election where early voting will be offered will be the February 2024 presidential primary election.

NEW ELECTION DROP BOX INSTALLED

A New Election Drop Box has been installed near the entry doors of City Hall. Residents can place their forms to register to vote, applications for ballots and ballots in this drop box. PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Just a reminder that there is No Overnight Parking on any curbed streets within the City of Richmond from December 1st through April 1st.

Cars should be off of the streets from 3 a.m. to 6 a.m. to allow for snowplows to clear the streets.

The no parking restriction is in accordance with Traffic Control Order No. 1-2020. Thank you for your cooperation. Residents are also encouraged to remove their vehicles from the public streets during any snow event to assist the DPW in clearing the streets. Your cooperation allows the streets to be cleared in a timely manner.

YARD WASTE AND LEAF PICKUP

Yard Waste:

- Curbside yard waste is collected on Tuesdays from April to November.
- Yard waste must be placed in yard waste bags or garbage cans (32 gallons or less).
- Garbage cans must be marked yard waste.



- Cans can be spray painted with a large "X", or "Yard Waste" stickers are available at City Hall.
- Each bag or can must be 50 lbs or less.
- A maximum of 10 bags or containers can be placed each week.
- Twigs, sticks, and branches 4' or less in length can be bundled with twine.
- Yard waste mixed with trash will not be accepted.



Leaf Pickup:

- Place leaves in bags or approved containers.
- Please do not rake leaves into the street. The City does not own equipment intended for leaf collection.
- Property owners are responsible for maintaining the boulevard area between the curb and the sidewalk. This includes leaf removal.
- Street sweepers are not design to pick up significant amounts of leaves. The leaves clog filters and screens, causing premature wear on the equipment.





DINING SENIOR STYLE

Dining Senior Style is a daily lunch program that provides an opportunity to have a well-balanced meal while engaging in social activities with their peers.

This program is offered at various locations throughout Macomb County, including our Community Center in Beebe Street Park. The staff works hard to ensure each meal meets the recommended dietary guidelines. Seniors can enjoy a vast array of social activities including card games, seasonal parties, crafts and more. You must be age 60 or older to participate. Spouses of those 60 and older can participate in the program, regardless of their age. Lunch is served on a "first come, first served" basis, Monday through Friday, unless otherwise noted. A \$3.00 contribution is suggested for each meal. All donations go directly back into the program to help serve more seniors. Contact our Recreation Department at (586) 727-3064 for more information.



MEALS ON WHEELS

Meals on Wheels is designed for older adults who are home-bound & unable to prepare meals for themselves. Through the program, a volunteer delivers a meal directly to the seniors' door. Hot meals are locally prepared fresh on a daily basis and meet the recommended dietary guidelines.

Eligibility:

- The person must be at least 60 years of age or be the spouse of a person at least 60 years of age.
- A Macomb County resident.
- The individual must be home-bound (unable to leave their home without assistance).
- The individual must be physically or emotionally unable to obtain food or prepare full meals.
- Eligibility for this program is not based on income

\$3.50 contribution is suggested for each meal. All donations go directly back into the program to help provide meals.

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING SCHEDULE

Use the map and schedule for each year to determine your recycle week as follows:

Streets split by service weeks will be collected on the week indicated (green side one week and gold side the following week). First determine if your residence is located in the green or gold section of the map. The color of the map where your residence is located corresponds to the color on the annual schedule and indicates your recycle week and day for each month and year. Place your recycle cart at the curb on the designated day on the schedule. Waste Management will provide you with a new recycle schedule for dates beyond August 2022.

PLACE YOUR RECYCLE CART AT THE CURB ON THE SAME DAY AS YOUR TRASH EVERY OTHER WEEK ACCORDING TO THE SCHEDULE.



You can use Credit or Debit cards with the Mastercard, Visa, Discover or American Express logos OR make Electronic Check payments online. The Electronic Check option requires inputting your routing number and either your savings or checking account number.

Convenience fees for these payment methods are as follows:

Credit or Debit Card - 3% of total amount, minimum of \$2

Online Electronic Check:

- \$3 flat fee for any amount UNDER \$10,000
- \$10 flat fee for any amount OVER \$10,000

If you would like to sign up for online bill pay or enroll in automatic payments (in which the City will debit your account directly eliminating a paper check being mailed by your bank), visit the City of Richmond website at www.cityofrichmond.net, look for the "How Do I" heading and select "Pay...Utility Bills"
