WINTER PARKING RULES

END APRIL 1ST

PARKING ALLOWED ON CURBED STREETS

DOES NOT INCLUDE TRAVEL TRAILERS, UTILITY TRAILERS OR BOATS

YARD WASTE

- Curbside yard waste is collected on Tuesdays from April to November.
- Yard waste must be placed in yard waste bags or garbage cans (32 gallons or less).
- Garbage cans must be marked yard waste.
- Cans can be spray painted with a large "X", or "Yard Waste" stickers are available at City Hall.
- Each bag/can must be 50 lbs or less.
- A maximum of 10 bags or containers can be placed each week.

Twigs, sticks, and branches 4' or less in length can be bundled with twine. Yard waste mixed with trash will not be accepted.

RICHMOND HERITAGE FESTIVAL

RAHGS will be holding their annual Heritage Festival on Saturday, June 29th & Sunday, June 30th, 10am-4pm.

WATER SERVICE MATERIAL IDENTIFICATION



This year EGLE is requiring that all municipal water providers verify the type of material used in water service lines for houses built within a certain time frame. The City is required to physically inspect 25% of service lines with unknown material types.

This summer, DPW is using the Vac Truck to "pot-hole" Truck down to the water service in the front yards in order to identify the service line materials. This is done three feet away from the shut off. We then ask the homeowner to allow us in their home to verify the interior material. If the resident isn't home, we leave the flyer as a door hanger. The resident has the option of taking a photo of their service line and emailing it to the City.



The cost of this is being paid for through a grant.

EARLY VOTING IN RICHMOND

The Presidential Primary Election was the first time the constitutionally required “9 days of Early Voting” was offered in the State of Michigan. A total of ninety-three (93) Richmond voters exercised their right to vote during this unprecedented time. This will be offered again for the upcoming State Primary and for the General Election on the following days and times:

STATE GENERAL ELECTION

Tuesday, November 5th (7am - 8pm) at your designated precinct

Beat the crowds on Election Day and visit the Early Voting Site to cast your ballot. These flexible dates and times will allow voting capabilities convenient to your schedule.

Are you interested in automatically receiving a ballot for every future election? This is now an option! In years past, an application for an absentee ballot was required to be filled out every year. This now is a one (1) time sign-up covering all future elections. Call the Clerk's office 727-7571 ext. 204 to request an application.



BURN PERMITS

The City of Richmond Fire Department requires that you get a Burn Permit any time you are going to do an open burning.



OPEN BURNING PERMITS ARE FREE

Permits can be obtained at the Richmond Police Department or on the City website. Under the “How Do I” tab at the top of the page, under the “Apply For” column, select “Burn Permit” and then click on the underlined “Burn Permit” link and fill out the online form. Please all rules and regulations on the City website.

You must be 18 years or older to obtain a burn permit. During a dry period, the Fire Department may have a ban on open burning & will not issue any permits.

- Campfires must be kept less than 3 feet in diameter & less than 3 feet in height. Fires can be ground pits, mesh grills, and/or fireplaces.
- It must be located more than 50 feet from any structure.
- Permits will be issued for 4 days.
- Residents may have a small camp or cooking fire for recreation.
- The camp fire must be attended at all times.
- The camp fire shall consist only of seasoned dry firewood and shall not emit any obnoxious odors or smoke.

There is to be no burning of leaves, grass clippings, garbage, sawn, or processed wood.

Register your golf cart by visiting our website at www.cityofrichmond.net. Under the “How Do I” tab at the top of the page, you can then select “Golf Carts” under the “Register For” column. Print and fill out the registration application and return it with your proof of insurance to the Richmond Police Department.

New golf cart owners - bring your golf cart on a trailer to the Richmond Police Department at 36725 Division Road and an Officer will process your registration application, examine your cart and check your proof of insurance. 

Pre-Requisites are:

- You must be at least 15 years of age by the first day of class and be able to provide proof of age.
- Sequence 1 – submerge, then swim 150 yards using front-crawl, breaststroke or both. Maintain position at surface for 2 minutes using only legs. Then swim 50 yards using front crawl, breaststroke or both.
- Sequence 2 – swim 20 yards. Next, surface dive to depth of 7-10 feet & retrieve 10-pound object. Return to surface and swim 20 yards on back to return to starting point, holding the object at the surface with both hands and keeping face near surface. Lastly, exit water without using ladder or steps.




MAY PUZZLE COMPETITION

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING SCHEDULE

Use the map and schedule for each year to determine your recycle week as follows:

Streets split by service weeks will be collected on the week indicated (green side one week and gold side the following week). First determine if your residence is located in the green or gold section of the map. The color of the map where your residence is located corresponds to the color on the annual schedule and indicates your recycle week and day for each month and year. Place your recycle cart at the curb on the designated day on the schedule. Waste Management will provide you with a new recycle schedule for dates beyond August 2022.

PLACE YOUR RECYCLE CART AT THE CURB ON THE SAME DAY AS YOUR TRASH EVERY OTHER WEEK ACCORDING TO THE SCHEDULE.



DID YOU KNOW YOU CAN PAY YOUR TAXES & UTILITIES ONLINE?



You can use Credit or Debit cards with the Mastercard, Visa, Discover or American Express logos OR make Electronic Check payments online. The Electronic Check option requires inputting your routing number and either your savings or checking account number.

Convenience fees for these payment methods are as follows:

Credit or Debit Card - 3% of total amount, minimum of \$2

Online Electronic Check:

- \$3 flat fee for any amount UNDER \$10,000
- \$10 flat fee for any amount OVER \$10,000

If you would like to sign up for online bill pay or enroll in automatic payments (in which the City will debit your account directly eliminating a paper check being mailed by your bank), visit the City of Richmond website at www.cityofrichmond.net, look for the "How Do I" heading and select "Pay...Utility Bills"

ANIMAL OWNERS

In accordance with Section 14 of the City's Code of Ordinance, residents are reminded that all animals that enter or remain in any public park or recreation area, public building, or any building or area which is open to the general public, **must be attached to a leash with a maximum length of eight feet.** The only exception would be for a guide dog or leader dog which is trained to assist a blind person.

Section 14 further prohibits any animal to defecate on any public thoroughfare, passageway, sidewalk, bypass, play area, park or any place where people congregate or walk, **unless the owner immediately removes all droppings and disposes of them in a sanitary method.** The cooperation of all animal owners is appreciated by the City and helps to ensure that all public areas remain nuisance free so they can be enjoyed by all residents.



Also included in Section 14 of the Ordinance is the **limit on the number of animals an owner may have; the quantity is limited to 2 adult dogs and 2 adult cats.** Any other animals must be approved by City Council prior to purchase.
