On July 1, 2024, the contractor for the collection of residential waste, recycling and yard waste in the City of Richmond is changing from Waste Management (WM) to Priority.

New collection day – beginning Monday, July 1st the City's collection day for trash, recycling and yard waste will be moved from Tuesday to MONDAY. All trash, recycling (south of Division Road) and yard waste should be placed out by 7:00 am, Monday, July 1st.



Recycling - Recycling will remain bi-weekly utilizing the existing 64-gallon yellow topped WM carts. Priority will continue to use the same schedule for recycling collection used by WM.

- Residents living south of Division Road will have their first recycling collection on Monday, July 1st.
- Residents living north of Division Road will have their first recycling collection on Monday, July 8th.

Trash Carts - If a resident purchased a 96-gallon trash cart from WM, these carts will continue to be serviced by Priority. Residents wishing to purchase a 96-gallon trash cart or an additional 64-gallon recycling cart should contact Priority directly at 1-855-927-8365. **All carts that are currently being leased, will now become property of the homeowner. WM will NOT be picking up any carts.**

Yard Waste – The collection of yard waste does not change other than moving from a Tuesday to a Monday collection day. There is still a 10-bag limit on yard waste.

The City Council made the decision to switch companies in order to continue the same service level that our residents are accustomed to receiving. The extension proposal received from WM would have reduced the level of service and increased the cost. By switching to Priority, the cost for this service will be reduced from \$234.56 (2023) to \$224.00 (2024) per year. The new contract with Priority calls for 4% increases each year while the proposal from WM called for 5% increases.

COLLECTION SCHEDULE

Your trash and yard waste pick ups will occur each week on **MONDAY**. To ensure pick up, please have your items at the curb by 7:00 AM or the night before (After 7:00 PM).

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

GOOD – Grass clippings, leaves, shrubs, & brush trimmings (under 4 inches in diameter a& less than 4 feet in length).

BAD – Sod, pet waste, dirt, rocks, trash, root balls, branches (over 4 inches in diameter or longer than 4 feet in length).

Yard waste is collected the first **MONDAY** in April through the last **MONDAY** in November.

Place yard waste at the curb four (4) feet from your rubbish in brown paper yard bags or a 32-gallon container, clearly marked "Yard Waste".

BULK PICK UP

Large items such as furniture, appliance, stoves, hot water tanks, grills, etc. will be collected on the same day with your rubbish. Please remove any doors from refrigerators or appliances before placing at the curb (FREON REMOVED). Carpet is accepted. One Bulk Item per week. No call ahead needed.


SOLID WASTE COLLECTION

Priority will collect solid waste placed curbside in carts up to 96-gallons in size or properly bagged. Do not place rubbish at curbside in paper bags. Maximum weight per container is 50 pounds per bag and 75 pounds per cart. **Priority will continue to service your current cars (maximum 96 gallons).**

RECYCLING COLLECTION

Recycling will be collected on a bi-weekly basis on Mondays. Pick up time may vary. Make sure you recycling is out before 7:00AM or the night before to ensure it is picked up. Recycling material must be contained in a properly marked cart. Rain, snow, dirt and other environmental elements can contaminate recycling material. Keep recycling clean and dry by placing in a cart with a lid. Place your recycling at the curb and away from vehicles and mailboxes.

EARLY VOTING IN RICHMOND

The Presidential Primary Election was the first time the constitutionally required "9 days of Early Voting" was offered in the State of Michigan. This will be offered again for the upcoming State Primary and for the General Election on the following days and times:

STATE PRIMARY **EARLY VOTING**

Saturday, July 27th – Sunday, August 4th, (8:30am - 4:30pm)
Inside City Hall (36725 Division Road)

STATE GENERAL **EARLY VOTING**

Saturday, October 26th – Sunday, November 3rd, (8:30am - 4:30pm) Inside City Hall (36725 Division Road)

STATE PRIMARY ELECTION

Tuesday, August 6th (7am - 8pm) at your designated precinct

STATE GENERAL ELECTION

Tuesday, November 5th (7am - 8pm) at your designated precinct

Beat the crowds on Election Day and visit the Early Voting Site to cast your ballot. These flexible dates and times will allow voting capabilities convenient to your schedule.

You now have the option to automatically receive a ballot for every future election. In years past, an application for an absentee ballot was required to be filled out every year. This now is a one (1) time sign-up covering all future elections. Call the Clerk's office 727-7571 ext. 204 to request an application.



WEED CUTTING

Residents are reminded that Section 98-56 of the City of Richmond Code of Ordinances, requires that all noxious weeds be cut "at least twice a year," once on or before the first day of June and again on or before the first date of September or at any other time that the height exceeds 12 inches in height.



Property owners failing to comply with the provisions of this ordinance will be liable for the expense of the cutting of the weeds. Any costs incurred by the City to have the weeds cut will be placed on the property owner's tax bill.

BLIGHT!

We all know what it is and would like to avoid it. Just a reminder that residents need to continue to maintain their house and yards free of junk and unlicensed vehicles, trash, tires, and blight that detracts from the neighborhoods and positive image we want for our City. We appreciate the citizens involvement in trying to keep our community looking great!!!



BURN PERMIT REGULATIONS

The RVFD requires that you get a [Burn Permit](#) anytime you are going to do open burning. **OPEN BURNING PERMITS ARE FREE.** Permits can be applied for at the Richmond Police Dept, 36725 Division Road, or on the City website. Under the "How Do I" tab at the top of the page, under the "Apply For" column, select "Burn Permit" and then click on the underlined "[Burn Permit](#)" link and fill out the online form. You must be 18 years or older to obtain a burn permit. During a dry period, the RVFD may ban open burning & will not issue any permits.

- Campfires must be kept less than 3' in diameter & less than 3' in height. Fires can be ground pits, mesh grills, and/or fireplaces.
- It must be located more than 50' from any structure.
- Permits will be issued for up to 4 days.
- Residents may have a small camp or cooking fire for recreation.
- The camp fire must be attended at all times.
- The camp fire shall consist only of seasoned dry firewood & shall not emit any obnoxious odors or smoke.
- There is to be no burning of leaves, grass clippings, garbage, sawn, or processed wood.

Register your golf cart by visiting our website at www.cityofrichmond.net. Under the "How Do I" tab at the top of the page, you can then select "Golf Carts" under the "Register For" column. Print and fill out the registration application and return it with your proof of insurance to the Richmond Police Department.

New golf cart owners - bring your golf cart on a trailer to the Richmond Police Department at 36725 Division Road and an Officer will process your registration application, examine your cart and check your proof of insurance. 



RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

Summer months bring lots of sunshine and begins the season of camping and boating. Just a reminder to all residents that RV's, travel trailers, campers, boats, etc. parked at a residence must adhere to the code of ordinances for the City of Richmond. A brief explanation of the code and an illustration is below for your reference.

Pursuant to Article 9, Section 9.04 (Residential Parking Standards) of the Richmond Zoning Ordinance/ Section 9.04 says in part: *Off street parking spaces for single-and two-family (duplex) dwellings shall consist of an accessory driveway, garage, parking strip or bay, or combination thereof, subject to the following: One (1) recreational vehicle, as defined in Section 25.02 (Definitions), may be parked or stored by the owner of a residential lot within any non-required side or rear yard area, provided that use of the vehicle for living or residential purposes shall be prohibited.*

Pursuant to Article 25, Section 146 (Recreational Vehicle) of the Richmond Zoning Ordinance/Section 146 says in part: **Recreational Vehicle.** *A vehicle which is self-propelled or permanently towable by motor vehicle; designed primarily for use as temporary living quarters, or for recreational, camping, travel or seasonal use; and required by Michigan law to have a valid vehicle registration when traveling upon public roads.*



The violation is a municipal civil infraction, for which the fine shall not be less than \$75 for the 1st offense, not less than \$100 for any offense which is a first repeat offense, and not less than \$250 for any offense which is a 2nd repeat offense, PLUS costs and other sanctions allowed by Michigan law or Richmond City Ordinances.

DID YOU KNOW YOU CAN PAY YOUR TAXES & UTILITIES ONLINE?



You can use Credit or Debit cards with the Mastercard, Visa, Discover or American Express logos OR make Electronic Check payments online. The Electronic Check option requires inputting your routing number and either your savings or checking account number.

Convenience fees for these payment methods are as follows:
Credit or Debit Card - 3% of total amount, minimum of \$2

Online Electronic Check:

- \$3 flat fee for any amount UNDER \$10,000
- \$10 flat fee for any amount OVER \$10,000

If you would like to sign up for online bill pay or enroll in automatic payments (in which the City will debit your account directly eliminating a paper check being mailed by your bank), visit the City of Richmond website at www.cityofrichmond.net, look for the "How Do I" heading and select "Pay...Utility Bills"

ANIMAL OWNERS

In accordance with Section 14 of the City's Code of Ordinance, residents are reminded that all animals that enter or remain in any public park or recreation area, public building, or any building or area which is open to the general public, **must be attached to a leash with a maximum length of eight feet**. The only exception would be for a guide dog or leader dog which is trained to assist a blind person.

Section 14 further prohibits any animal to defecate on any public thoroughfare, passageway, sidewalk, bypass, play area, park or any place where people congregate or walk, **unless the owner immediately removes all droppings and disposes of them in a sanitary method.**



The cooperation of all animal owners is appreciated by the City and helps to ensure that all public areas remain nuisance free so they can be enjoyed by all residents.

Also included in Section 14 of the Ordinance is the **limit on the number of animals an owner may have; the quantity is limited to 2 adult dogs and 2 adult cats**. Any other animals must be approved by City Council prior to purchase.
